ITINERARY

Day **1**

Toronto Montréal | VIA Rail Business Class

Enjoy the facilities of the Business Class Lounge before boarding the train. Complimentary newspapers and non-alcoholic beverages are available in the lounge. Once on your way, the train follows the shores of Lake Ontario, one of the five Great Lakes of North America, to Trenton Junction, where the St. Lawrence River flows from the lake. Passing the village of Napanee, look south as you cross the river to view a series of beautiful waterfalls. The city of Kingston is a historic Canadian city, being the early capital of the "Province of Canada" (1841-1867) and is the birthplace of Canada's first Prime Minister, Sir John A. Macdonald. Here, you cross the Rideau Canal, built in 1832 to connect Kingston with Ottawa and originally designed after the War of 1812 to guarantee a supply route north of the US border in the event of another war. Past Cornwall, the line enters the Province of Québec. Approaching Montréal, cross the Ottawa River to Dorval, before arriving at Central Station in Montréal. The station is located below the Fairmont Queen Elizabeth Hotel in the heart of downtown.

Day **3**

Montréal Québec City | VIA Rail Business Class

Following the St. Lawrence River, pass from city suburbs to the rural landscapes of forests and rich pastures, dotted with tiny villages that extend to Québec City. For the first hour, you will note the rugged Monteregian Hills that seem to loom up from nowhere. These huge volcanic mounds were formed over 120 million years ago. There are seven of these hills in a row, including Mont Royal in Montréal, ending with Monte Rouge near the tiny village of Boloeil. Many of the trees you see are maple trees, producing the great Canadian staple, maple syrup. Your rail journey is just over two hours to Québec, the oldest walled city in North America and the heart of French Canadian culture of Canada. Arrive into Québec at Gare du Palais. Steeped in history, Québec is the most charming city in Canada, 400 years old and most of the original architecture and buildings have been lovingly preserved.

- **Rendezvous with History Quebec City Tour:**

This is your chance to visit history first-hand. The Latin Quarter, Plains of Abraham, Ramparts, world-famous Château Frontenac, National Assembly, Basilica, City Hall, Place-Royale, Citadelle and a glimpse of modern Quebec City are the perfect introduction to the city.

OR

- **A Fabulous Country Tour:**

Travel back in time to rural Quebec along the Chemin du Roy to Sainte Anne-de-Beaupré, and pass through the many traditional villages of rural Québec. In Sainte-Anne-de-Beaupré, you will be given time to visit the world-famous Shrine and a stop at the Montmorency Falls. Just as you think your day is over, you will be treated to a short visit to the Island of Orléans, discovered by Jacques Cartier in 1535, where the picturesque village of Sainte-Pétronille, with its 19th-century rural atmosphere, waits to be rediscovered again.

OR

- **Historic Food Tour in Old Quebec:**

Join Louis Hébert or Marie Rollet, renowned as the first farmers of New France, on this tour that combines the history of the old city with the evolution of local agricultural knowledge. These notable characters will share how they established homes in the heart of Old Québec and persevered through harsh winters and scarce food supplies. This tour offers an authentic experience of Old Québec and its local flavours, including four tastings at local establishments.
